

JUST TRYAN IT achieved great success in 2023, 765 racers competed in our two Kids Triathlons, 32 of them achieved STAR Supporter status raising over \$1,000 each and together we raised \$389,000 to support families with a child in cancer treatment in 2024. 


The National Cancer Institute reports that over the past 30 years the childhood cancer survival rate has increased from 30% to 80%. More children are living with cancer; they receive ongoing medical care both outpatient and in the hospital and this treatment is expensive. JUST TRYAN IT supports these families on their journey by helping them to meet their basic needs. Our goal is to relieve the financial stress that impacts a family's ability to adhere to treatment plans and access care.

Additionally, while cancer does not discriminate, the financial hardship of cancer treatment does. 61% of JTI patient families are living on a post diagnosis income of less than \$40,000. The American Cancer Society's 2020 *The Cost of Cancer* report states, "Low income, less educated and people of color are more likely to feel the financial impact of a child's cancer diagnosis." In 2023, JUST TRYAN IT supported a total of 156 families: 113 families with Emergency Assistance grants, 18 with Deep Need grants, and 25 families with gift cards.

THE COST OF CANCER

When your child is diagnosed with cancer the last thing you think about is, "how much is this going to cost?" Parents do whatever it takes to get their child the care they need, this often means maxing out the credit cards and missing mortgage/rent payments. JUST TRYAN IT helps families pay their bills, so that they can focus on the health and well-being of their child and mitigate the long term financial impact of cancer treatment.

OUR IMPACT IN 2023

JUST TRYAN IT provided 113 families with Emergency Assistance grants, totaling \$181,221. The average Emergency Assistance grant was \$1,603. The goal of Emergency Assistance is to help families meet immediate needs. The Deep Need grant program was created to provide more sustained relief to the needlest families. In 2023, we distributed 18 Deep Need grants for a total of \$120,000. The average Deep Need grant was \$6,666. These grants are distributed over three to six months and support essentials like housing, utilities and food.

MEET MANUEL

Manuel and his mother, Cristina, moved to the United States five years ago. Cristina worked hard and built her own business cleaning houses. Manuel was diagnosed his senior year of high school and his treatment forced him to miss his graduation. Once he was diagnosed, his mom had to stop working to take care of him. They had no income and no savings to rely on. "Your grant paid our rent for many months and the money I got from that grant bought healthy food to keep Manuel strong during his treatment." Cristina, mother of Manuel. Manuel completed treatment and rang the bell in December 2023. He is looking forward to enrolling in college next year.



JUST TRYAN IT provides grants to families in treatment at our partner hospitals in the Washington Metropolitan region and the Triangle region of North Carolina. These hospitals are Children's National Medical Center, INOVA Children's Hospital, Johns Hopkins Children's Center, Samelson Children's Hospital at Sinai, Duke Children's and UNC Children's.

MEET THE OSTEN-LISS FAMILY

Ilana Osten first heard about the Chapel Hill Kids Triathlon in early 2017. As a pediatric physical therapist working in acute care at Duke, she sees firsthand the burden a cancer diagnosis places on a family. "As a mother and a human, it is heartbreaking to see the toll that cancer takes on the child and the entire family."

Ilana was drawn to the mission of JUST TRYAN IT and loved the idea of getting her boys involved in helping too. The first year her son, Jaime, raced and Ilana volunteered at packet pick-up. The family was overwhelmed by the race day experience. Ilana said, "It is such an important cause and the actual race day was super fun. After that experience I knew that I wanted to stay involved."

In 2018, both of the boys raced and Ilana served as the Start Zone captain. JUST TRYAN IT has become a family affair. Jason, Ilana's husband, does pre-race training with the boys and they both support them with their fundraising. Jaime started a JUST TRYAN IT team at the Duke School, recruiting friends to do the race with him.

In 2020, when the race went virtual, the Osten-Liss family was all in. "Kids don't stop getting cancer just because





there is a pandemic. I knew how hard it was for these families at the hospital. We raised money and had a great time biking and running through our neighborhood." Since then, Ilana has remained actively involved in the Host Committee launching the Duke School team each year and working with us to bring in more racers and partners. This year, her sons, Jaime and Cory, will both race, Ilana will volunteer and Jason will provide race day support. We are deeply grateful for their commitment to helping families fighting cancer.
